Your petitioner, *Wm. B. Broadwater*, respectfully represents to your Honorable Board, that she is a citizen of *L.L.E.* County, in the State of Alabama, and was such on the 1st day of January 1899; That she is the widow of *Co. M. Broadwater*, who served as a *private* in company *A.* of the *15th* Regiment *Ala.* Volunteers; That her husband ~~was killed,~~ *lost a leg in the war and* died, on the *5* day of *Oct.*, 18*84*; That he did not desert the service of the State of Alabama, nor of the Confederate States, that she has not since remarried, that she has no children upon whom she can depend for support, that all of her property do not exceed four hundred dollars in value, and that her annual income from all sources do not exceed four hundred dollars. She therefore respectfully asks your honorable board to place her name upon the pension rolls of the State as a member of the fourth class, that she may participate in the division of the fund provided for the relief of needy Confederate soldiers and sailors, and their widows, by an act of the General Assembly of Alabama, approved February 10, 1899.
