

Final Rites Held For Sgt. Eubank

Williamsburg, July 23.—Final rites for Tech. Sgt. Robert W. Eubank, formerly of Williamsburg, were held Thursday at Arlington National Cemetery. Sgt. Eubank, who was 25 years old at the time of his death, was killed in an air accident over England Dec. 18, 1944.

A native of Essex County, he was employed for several years by Colonial Williamsburg. At the time of his death, he was with the Sixty-first Troop Carrier Group and had taken part in war activities in the Mediterranean area and Europe before being moved to England. He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Eulah Mason Eubank, of Dunnsville; his parents, Mr. and Mrs. R. Booth Eubank of Dunnsville; two sisters, Miss M. Virginia Eubank and Mrs. Hildred Eubank Tyler, of Richmond, and two brothers, Richard Booth Eubank Jr., of Dunnsville, and Francis L. Eubank, of Williamsburg.
