In 1770 Church Petition from: The Singletons of S. C. by Virginia Eliza Green Singleton. Privately printed in Columbia, S. C., 1914.

Josiah, Sr., and two sons Christopher and Caleb were contributors to church, and also vestrymen of St. Mark's Parish Episcopal Church.

Josiah Gayle, Sr., was granted 200 acres of land on Nov. 23, 1769, in Craven County on High Hills of Sante, S. C. Also on July 2, 1771, he was granted 388 acres more.

Josiah, Sr., and Caleb both signed the "Association for Protection" (or Bill of Rights, or South Carolina's Declaration of Independence - whatever one might call it).

Caleb Gayle was born ca. 1756 and died ca. 1818, near Clinton in the parish of Feliciana, La. He married about 1778 in Sumpter Co., S. C., Amelia (?), born ca. 1760, d. 1845 at Feliciana, La. Caleb was a farmer and a member of the Episcopal Church. Children:
