In the name of God Amen, I Wance Wbain of the County of Guilford and State of North Carolina being in a low State of health, But of perfect and disposing mind and Memory, thanks be to gods, and calling to mind the Mortality of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last Will and testament, that is to say, Principally and first of all, I give and recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it, and my Body I recommend to the Earth, to be buried in decent Christian Burial at the discretion of my Executors, and as touching such worldly estate whatsoever, I both praise God to Bless me in this life, I give, devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form (viz)

- Item 1st I give and Bequeath to my dearly Belov'd wife, Jane Wbain, one Bed andstead and furniture her choice one chert, one pot her choice, one Dutch Oven her choice, one Skillet, two pair pot hooks, one iron potrack her choice, one set of knives and forks, one set of plates, one set of cups and saucers, one plate dish, one earthen dish, one Bay mare, two Cows her choice, two ewes her choice, one sow and pigs her choice, eight sheep in the pen, two plows and gear her choice, one yalling ox, one matock, two hog her choice, one tub, two pair, her choice and one Churn, to be at her own disposal
- Item 2nd I also give and Bequeath to my wife Jane during her life one Cupboard, and one large yellow leaf table, and after her death I allow the Cupboard to belong to my Daughter Mary, and the yellow leaf table to my son Guy Wbain
- Item 3rd I give and Bequeath to my two sons Hugh and John Wbain my four Lots of ground adjoining each other forty feet front each, on the East side of Hillsborough Street in the town of Fayetteville to them and their heirs forever, provided each of them pay the sum of twenty five dollars to my Executor
- Item 4th I give and Bequeath to my son Hann Wbain all the land which he have lying East of phoeby Creek between it runs into Hunting creek, then a South Course and deviation to a spring mark for that purpose a line on the School house branch a small distance above the market Street, then up the branch with the meanders thereof to the head of it to Samuel Holcomb, then with his line north to James Tommels corner Stake, then west with the various courses of Tommels line to the sd phoeby branch supposed to contain seventy four acres to him and his heirs forever
- Item 5th I give and Bequeath to my four sons George, Forber, Guy and Green Wbain the balance of my home tract of land, to be equally divided between them by giving due respect to the longness, so as to give them near an equal quantity of meadow lands, it is my will and devise that my son Green have the lot on which the Buildings are on, and my son Guy to have his lot adjoining Green's, it is also my will that my wife Jane Wbain have her maintenance off my son's Guy and Green's lots of land, her full amount is my desire that my friend James Tommels and my son William Wbain divide my home tract of land between my four sons above named to wit George, Forber, Guy, and Green, to them and their heirs forever
- Item 6th I give and Bequeath to my two daughters Lydia Burrey and Mary Wbain my undivided half of a tract of land that formerly belong to John Hamblin and Thomas Henderson supposed to contain in all Six Hundred and forty acres lying in the County of Rockingham on the Stillhouse branch of Rock house creek of damnear to them and their heirs forever
- Item 7th I give and Bequeath to my son Guy Wbain my Black Horse, and one Bed, bedstead and furniture
- Item 8th I give and Bequeath to my daughter Mary one Bed, bedstead and furniture, the one commonly called hury, and the Cupboard furniture commonly called her, and her Skiddle, also one oven and look, and one warrington
- Item 9th It is my will that my son Green have a horse worth sixty dollars, and one bed and furniture when he arrives to the age of twenty one years
- Item 10th I give and Bequeath to my daughter Mary one cow and calf, one ewe and lamb, and one breeding sow and to my son Guy one cow and calf, one ewe and lamb, and one breeding sow and to my son Green one cow and calf, one ewe and lamb, and one breeding sow when he comes to the age of twenty one years, and to my four sons Hugh, John, George, and Forber each one cow and calf, one ewe and lamb, one breeding sow, one Bed and furniture and furniture

Such the Value thereof in money, of an equal Value of those already willed away —

Item 11th It is my will that all my printed Books be Equally divided between my Children —

Item 12th And for the better maintenance of my wife and Family for one year I allow them Seven Hundred Pounds of Stack, one two year old Beef Steer, four barrels flour, five Bushels wheat, thirty Barrels Corn, and hay and Oats sufficient to feed the Stock one year —

Item 13th It is my will that my two Sons Guy and Green be schooled and taught out of my Estate in reading writing and Arithmetick so as to include the double Rule of three

Item 14th It is my will that all the balance of my property both real and personal of whatsoever nature or kind, be sold by my Executors, and if the Surplus will afford it, then to give my two daughters Lydia and Mary each one house boat worth sixty dollars, and the residue of my estate if any I allow my three Sons William, Hugh, and John the sum of twenty five dollars each to make them equal as to the larger they have received, and the Balance of my estate if any, I give to my two Sons Guy & Green

I do hereby appoint my son William McLean and Hugh McLean, my Executors to this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all former wills by me made Ratifying this and no other, and confirming this and no other to be my last will and testament

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty first day of October in the year Christ one thousand Eight Hundred and twenty four
