

658 SEVENTEENTH CENTURY ISLE OF WIGHT

ROGER BAGNALL, 350 acres 16 Nov. 1635. E. of land of Thomas Dangle, and south and S. E. of Pagan Cr. running southerly into the main woods, 300 acres by deed of sale from William Clapham, 3 Aug. 1635, and 50 for trans. of 1 servt.

JOHN VASSER, 150 acres 18 Nov. 1635. Being a neck of land lying upon Warsq. Creek next to the land of Warresquoake and Nathaniel Loyd for trans. of himself, wife Eliz. and 1 servt.

WILLIAM DAWSON, 150 acres, N. W. between Henry Hooper's land and the first point within the Great Cr. Due by deed of sale from Hugh Williams, to whom it was due for trans. 3 persons. 20 Nov. 1635.

BENNET BLEWITT, 50 acres at mouth of Warsq. Cr. 15 Feb. 1635. Due for per. adv. of his now wife Elizabeth.

RICHARD FRELAND, 100 acres adj. land of Thomas Jordan on N. side of Wars. River, and the other 100 on the south side of the river adj. Edward Rogers, for the pers. adv. of himself, wife and 2 children. 6 May 1636.

EDWARD ROGERS, 300 acres 14 May 1636. N. upon Cross Cr. adj. Thomas Jordans for trans. of Thomas Bulmer and 5 other persons.

PETER JOHNSON, 600 acres 1 June 1636. Lying N. E. and S. W. along the south side of Warsq. Creek upon the head of same and a butting upon Nansemond River. 100 acres due by surrender from John Day for his own per. adv. and that of one servt., 150 due by surrender from Ambrose Meader for per. adv. of himself, wife and one servant, 200 acres due by sur-
