In the name of God, Amen

I, Samuel Pascoe of said County being weak in  
body, but of a sound and disposing mind and  
memory, believing it to be my duty while in life

to make provisions for my family after my death, do hereby make establish and  
publish this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking and annulling all  
other wills by me heretofore made.

Item 1<sup>st</sup>

I desire that my body be laid away in a decent Christian like manner in the  
family burying ground at High Tower Church in this County under the Masonic Order  
my soul I give to God.

Item 2<sup>nd</sup>

I desire that my Executors herein after named proceed at once to collect all evidences  
of indebtedness due me as early as practicable after my death and pay all my just  
debts, including Physicians bills, burial expenses, and the cost of Probating and  
executing this will.
