State of Georgia Whitaker County
In the name of God - Amen.

I, Samuel Pascoe of said County being weak in body but of a sound and disposing mind and memory believing it to be my duty while in life to make provision for my family after my departure do hereby make establish and publish this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking and annulling all other wills by me heretofore made.

Item 1st

I desire that my body be laid away in a decent Christianlike manner in the family burying ground at Hightown Whitaker in this County under the Masonic order, my soul I give to God

Item 2nd

I desire that my Executors here in after named proceed at once to collect all evidences of indebtedness due me, as early as practicable after my death, and pay all my just debts including Physicians bills, burial expenses and the cost of Probating and executing this Will.

Item 3rd

I desire that all my property both Real and Personal be kept together by my Executors herein after named, and used for the support maintenance of my wife and Anne children that may be living with me at my death, my Realty consisting of my farm on Hightown River containing between Four and Six hundred acres more or less, my personal property consists of Horses, Mules, Cows, Hogs &c. &c. all of this property to be kept together and managed by my Executors for the best interest of my heirs and wife unless my wife Mary Pascoe should die or partition away, in that event I want my Executors to divide up my estate, and my children shall enjoy equal benefits from the distribution of my property

Item 4th

I desire at the death of my Wife that all of my property both Real and Personal and choses in action be sold and disposed of by my Executors under power herein as shall seem to them to be best interest of my estate and be distributed among my heirs or their legal representatives equally.
